

It is recommended that all college bound juniors take the SAT and/or the ACT in the Spring of their junior year, and then again in the Fall of the senior year, if needed. Most universities and colleges accept either the SAT or the ACT for admission, but some colleges require a specific test. Check the admission requirements of the colleges to which you are applying!

#### **SAT Reasoning Test and SAT Subject Tests**

The **SAT Reasoning Test** is a three hour and forty-five minute exam that measures critical thinking, mathematical reasoning, and writing skills. The **SAT Subject Tests** are one hour tests designed to show knowledge in a specific area. Students can take one, two, or three subject tests on a test day. Subject tests cannot be taken on the same day the student takes the SAT Reasoning Test. Most colleges do not require subject tests. Check the admission requirements of the colleges to which you are applying!

**SAT Test Registration** Register for the SAT at <u>www.collegeboard.com</u> Students will create an online account. If you already have an account from a previous school, <u>do NOT create another account</u>. If you cannot remember your login or user info, contact Collegeboard. Creating multiple accounts will complicate your status and you will eventually have to contact Collegeboard to rectify having multiple accounts.

## **SAT Registration Tips**

Register for the SAT at <u>www.collegeboard.com</u> Click--*Register for the SAT*, and then *Register Now*. Create a User Name and **Password**, and REMEMBER THEM! You will maintain ONE account throughout your high school career.

Enter your address--Click Outside the United States, use your APO Address and enter Japan for country.

Select High School—Click *Outside the United States*, add High School Code 561700 and click *Search for High School*, select *Edgren High School*. Register for the SAT. Complete College Profile.

Select Test Center--Select Outside the United States (code 67225)

**Select Your Test--SAT or SAT Subject Tests**. Most students take only the SAT. Most colleges do not require the SAT Subject Tests. Check the admission requirements for the colleges you are applying to.

Test Date--select your test date.

Select Test Center--click Search by School Name or Code, Select Japan, Test Center Code--Check Yes and add Test Center Code 67225 Select Search for My Test Center, Select Edgren HS.

Continue to Payment Information.

# ACT

The ACT Test contains tests in four areas: English, Mathematics, Reading, and Science.

### Edgren High School Code—561700 ACT Test Center Code—866900

The MyACT account system has replaced the Student Web Account system for students testing outside of the US. If the student does not already have a MyACT account, they will need to create one. This is a separate account from any tests they may have taken previously. The student can create a new MyACT account at, <u>https://my.act.org</u>. The student will be asked to enter their name, birth date, and email address. In addition, they will be asked to create a password and Customer Service Pin (this is a four digit number of their choosing that will add an extra level of security verification to the account). Once the account is created, please follow the instructions below:

### **ACT Registration Instructions**

1. Log in to the MyACT account.

2. Click on 'Products' and 'Select Product' under the ACT. You will then select 'Begin Registration' to start the process.

- 3. Please select 'Outside the U.S., and then answer the accommodations question.
- 4. After you have selected your test type (ACT with Writing or No Writing) you will search for a test center.

Select your Test Center: EHS Test Center Code-866900-Edgren High School should appear. Once you have

decided where you will be testing in, select the test date and time and click 'Add to Cart'.

5. Click on the cart icon at the top of the page to check out and go through the student's personal information. If examinees are experiencing difficulty creating accounts, they will need to contact ACT Customer Care by email <u>myact@act.org</u> or call 319-337-1270. Once you submit your payment, you will receive an on-screen confirmation and a confirmation email.

Please note, students who are testing outside of the United States will not have an admission ticket.
